Each student is paired with an Academic Mentor, ensuring personalized guidance and support. With a teacher-student ratio of 1:7 and relatively small class sizes, we are able to provide individual attention, allowing for a more tailored and focused learning experience.

Our Journey: The Founding of Birla Public School

80 years ago, in 1944, Birla Public School was established to provide the sons of India with a liberal and enlightened education, empowering them to keep pace with the ever-advancing spirit of the age. Renowned as "Vidya Niketan," or "The Golden Gate to Knowledge," the school was inaugurated by Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru and operates under the aegis of the Birla Education Trust.

Originally founded as a Montessori school under the expert guidance of Dr. Maria Montessori, the world-famous pioneer in child education, it was first known as "Shishu Mandir." The institution served as a day school until 1948, when the first hostel was built, marking a significant milestone in its journey toward becoming a fully residential institution. In 1952, the school was accepted as a full member of the prestigious Indian Public Schools' Conference (IPSC).

The visionary leadership of Shri G.D. Birla, a prominent industrialist, educationist, and philanthropist, was instrumental in this transformation. Through his foresight and dedication, this nursery school gradually developed into a fully-fledged public school by 1954. It was Shri G.D. Birla's dream to establish a unique educational system amid the sand dunes of Rajasthan, an area once characterized by a mix of tall imperial buildings and humble mud huts.

What began with just 20 students has now blossomed into a thriving institution with approximately 1,100 students across three independent sections, all receiving a holistic and global education.



Geographical Location & Climate

Pilani is nestled in the Shekhawati Region of Rajasthan, where East meets West. It boasts excellent connectivity, with two nearby railway stations—Chirawa (13 km for Jaipur) and Loharu (23 km for Delhi)—along with regular bus and train services linking it to major cities. The journey to Delhi or Jaipur by road takes about four hours.

The climate features hot summers and cool winters, with monsoons bringing a magical transformation to the landscape, enriching the arid terrain and enhancing the town's natural beauty.

Organization

The school is governed by the School Management Committee under the auspices of the Education Trust, led by the Principal and supported by a dedicated academic and administrative staff.

Each House is overseen by a Housemaster, who is assisted by an Assistant Housemaster, House Tutors, and a Superintendent/Matron to ensure pastoral care.

The Junior Section is headed by a Headmaster and features a specialized staff that focuses on meeting the unique needs of boys aged 9 to 13 in classes V to VIII.

The school prepares students for the Secondary School Certificate Examination (Class 10) and the Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (Class 12) conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi.

School Structure

The school is organized into three sections:

 Junior Section:Montessori and Preparatory wings for children aged 10 to13 in classes V to VIII.

- Middle Section: Comprising classes IX and X.
- Senior Section:

 Encompassing classes XI
 and XII. Boys seeking
 admission to Class V should
 be at least 10 years old.

Junior Section

The Junior Section of Birla Public School (BPS) is uniquely designed based on the principles of Dr. Maria Montessori, making it the only school in India with an academic block conceived by this renowned educationist. Catering to classes V to VIII, this self-contained campus fe a tures well-equipped classrooms, hostels, a dining mess, a canteen, and a Medical Infirmary (MI).

Students have access to a Language Lab, Science Lab, and Computer Lab, along with reliable internet throughout the campus. Additional amenities include a wading pool, skating rink, and mini playgrounds designed for younger children, all surrounded by beautifully landscaped gardens with charming fairy fountains.

Middle Section

Established in 1994, the Middle Section of Birla Public School (BPS) focuses on a comprehensive approach to the sound intellectual and emotional growth of students. Spanning 7 acres adjacent to the Senior Section, this architecturally appealing campus is fully equipped with separate hostel buildings and expansive playgrounds.

The hostels are outfitted with modern amenities and the latest equipment to ensure a comfortable living environment. The school aims to develop each child's overall personality through a diverse range of activities, including gymnastics, Western music, archery, martial arts, clay modeling, skating, and boxing. The Middle Section caters to classes IX and X, providing a well-rounded education to its students





SENIOR SECTION

In the Senior Section, students in classes XI and XII benefit from a robust educational framework supported by upgraded laboratories in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Language, Mathematics, Computer Science, and Social Science. These facilities are designed to inspire and cultivate the talents of future innovators and thinkers. The section is home to five spacious and well-equipped hostels, offering modern amenities to ensure a comfortable living environment.

The entire campus is self-contained, with strong Wi-Fi connectivity throughout, allowing students to engage with digital resources easily. Among the highlights is a state-of-the-art auditorium, featuring advanced German technology and seating for 600 people, ideal for hosting events and performances.

Students can also enjoy a freshwater swimming pool, a large dining hall, and a gymnasium. The well-appointed workshops provide hands-on learning experiences, while the Godhuli Stadium serves as a tranquil open-air space for reflection and contemplation. The extensive playgrounds offer ample opportunities for physical activity and sports, promoting a balanced lifestyle.

To ensure comfort and convenience, all hostels and dining halls across the three sections of the school are centrally aircooled and equipped with an uninterrupted power supply, creating an optimal environment for learning and personal growth.





Care for the Individual Boy

Every child is specially taken care of. We aim to teach pupils self-discipline. Standards of behaviour are expected to be high. We expect our boys to do well and we take every opportunity to congratulate and reward them. High expectations and a culture of praise are, we believe, central to the success of our pupils. In Junior Section approx. 300 students are housed in Shishu Griha 1 & 2, Kumar Griha, Kishore Griha and Bal Griha. The Houses are specially designed to cater to their psychological and physical needs. The Matron's room is attached to dormitories and is so well planned that she can see all dormitories from her room.

The Middle Section has five Houses viz. Buddha House, Mahavir House, Dayanand House, Guru Nanak House & Vivekanand House. Each house consists of well-planned dormitories with the capacity of 80 students. Every dormitory provides spacious accommodation for boys with attached washrooms. Apart from this, there is a separate study room and a beautiful common room in which the boys enjoy in their leisure time with indoor games like Chess, Ludo and Table Tennis etc. and enjoy the facility of library books and music. The House Master, Assistant House Master and attendant reside in the house itself to look after the boys all the time. In total, every faculty member of the house strives very hard to make the boys feel at home and create a healthy and conducive environment for the holistic development of the students.

In the Senior Section, the students are divided into five Houses viz Kanad, Panini, Vyas, Katyayan & Patanjali House. Every house has its separate building to accommodate 60 students. The Housemasters' quarters are adjacent to each house. Senior students are provided with well-furnished independent cubicles. The common study room is also well furnished. They study and work under the supervision of the Housemaster



FOOD

Great care is taken in cooking and serving a well-balanced diet four times a day.

Milk, milk products and green vegetables constitute an important part of the food served to the students.

The diet is strictly vegetarian though eggs are also given to those who wish to have it. Special diet is provided on medical advice.

House Staff dine with students.

MEDICAL CARE

A well-qualified doctor resides within the school premises to ensure the health and hygiene of the students.

For any student requiring additional care, referrals are made to Birla Sarvajanik Hospital or the Eye Hospital for specialized treatment.

Routine medical check-ups are conducted annually for all students. Medical leave is granted only after the school authorities, in consultation with the Resident Medical Officer (RMO), determine that it is adequate facilities are unavailable in Pilani.



HEALTH CENTRES

The school operates two Health Centres: one for the Junior Section and another for the Middle and Senior Sections, along with a dedicated isolation ward for students with infectious diseases. Two well-equipped dispensaries, overseen by a Medical Officer and supported by four full-time trained nurses, ensure comprehensive medical care, and an ambulance is available for emergencies.

The Medical Officer conducts regular medical check-ups, and vaccinations and inoculations are administered periodically, unless guardians provide health-related concerns in advance. Students' height and weight are recorded at the beginning and end of each term.

For minor ailments, parents are not notified. However, if a student is admitted to the hospital, a notification is sent to the parents or guardians.







COURSES OF STUDY

AFFILIATION

The school is affiliated with the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi, and is officially recognized by the Government of Rajasthan. It was granted permanent affiliation status effective from May 1, 1985 to Oct. 2018.

ACADEMIC YEAR

The academic year is divided into two terms:

The First Term runs from April 1st to September 30th, and The Second Term from October 1st to March 31st.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction is English, while Sanskrit and French are taught from Classes VI to X.

The curriculum is designed to prepare students for the Secondary and Senior School Certificate Examinations under the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), following the 10+2 education system."

ADMISSION

The school offers courses in Engineering, Medical, and Management streams for Class XI. Admission is finalized based on the student's performance in the Scholastic Assessment and Interview. The syllabus for the Scholastic Assessment will align with the curriculum of the previous class.



Scholastic Assessment for Admission:

Classes V to IX-scholastic Assessment consists of the following subjects:

English, Mathematics, Hindi and Reasoning ability. Class XI Scholastic Assessment consists of the following subject:

Engg. Group- Physics, Biology, Chemistry

Medical Group- Physics, Biology, Chemistry with Mathematics.

Management Group- English, Mathematics and Management Aptitude with

Humanities Group- English, SST and Reasoning Ability.

Subject combinations will be offered based on merit and vacancy.

Admission to class XI is provisional only and will be confirmed after qualifying the class X Board Examination.

For students in classes XI and XII the school provides three academic streams with the subject combinations as follows:

The school provides professional coaching and counseling for competitive exams such as IIT JEE, BITSAT, NEET, NDA, CLAT and Cambridge Assessments. This is facilitated by guest lecturers, professional coaching agencies, and specialized sessions delivered by faculty from BITS Pilani.

In addition, regular career counselling sessions are organized to guide students in making informed choices about their future. The school is also a registered **SAT** centre and is affiliated with **UCAS** and the **College Board**, streamlining the registration process for students seeking admission to universities abroad.

EXAMINATION

The school follows a structured system of Periodic Tests, including Pre-Mid Term, Mid-Term, Post-Mid Term, and Final Examinations, in accordance with CBSE guidelines up to Class X. Promotion to the next class is based on the cumulative academic performance throughout the entire session.

At Birla Public School (BPS), we provide parents with four detailed progress reports each year to keep them informed about their child's academic development. These assessments offer regular insights into how students are performing in relation to their abilities and potential.

Each Progress Report includes the following information:

- Current level of attainment in each subject
- Attitude towards learning, evaluated through indicators such as:
 - Attendance and punctuality
 - Performance in physical activities
 - Completion of assignments
 - Number of Reward Marks/Grades earned
- Housemaster's Report

The goal of this reporting system is to foster continuous communication between the school, students, and parents, ensuring consistent academic growth and development.

In line with its learning ethos, Birla Public School (BPS) employs both quantitative and qualitative assessment strategies and tools that encourage opportunities for peer and self-assessment.

The recording and reporting of individual student achievement are structured to provide detailed feedback, ensuring students understand their progress in relation to the specific assessment criteria for each subject group.

SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

The school annually awards the Aditya Vikram Birla Scholarships to meritorious students in recognition of their outstanding performance in both curricular and co-curricular activities.

COACHING

The school offers specialized coaching for senior students, focusing on preparations for NEET, JEE, BITSAT, CLAT and NDA. Only meritorious students selected by the School Academic Council are eligible to participate in these coaching programs.

Additionally, the school has introduced a Mentor and Buddy system to provide support to new students and those who may be academically struggling. This initiative aims to foster a nurturing environment and enhance students' success.

CAREERS AND COURSES

The school organizes Career Fairs, inviting representatives from various universities to address students and inform them about potential career choices. These events, along with regular career counseling sessions, play a vital role in guiding students toward informed decisions about their futures.

In the Senior Section Library, a dedicated 'Vocational Guidance Section' provides the latest information on various competitive examinations and admissions to institutions of higher learning. The library also houses relevant books and magazines that keep students updated on professional courses, including Medical, Engineering, NDA, Chartered Accountancy, and more. Comprehensive information is readily accessible to students.



The school is also a registered SAT centre and is affiliated with UCAS and the College Board, streamlining the registration process for students seeking admission to universities abroad.

Furthermore, the school is on the mailing lists of the UPSC and the Vocational Guidance Bureau of both the Central and State Governments, which regularly send updates about competitive examinations and courses.

To facilitate quick access to this information, separate reference files are maintained in the library, assisting students in making informed career decisions.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Students are invited to select electives for the academic year. Class VII and VIII students, choose any two options, while Class IX and X students, select one option from the following: Wood Craft Clay Modeling, Electronics, and Computer Science. Selections should be based on interests and strengths, and are subject to availability of seats and resources.

ART EDUCATION

Our Art Education curriculum encompasses Commercial Art, Painting, Music, Drama, and co-curricular activities including SPIC MACAY, fostering creative expression and holistic development.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The school places equal emphasis on co-curricular activities, fostering habits of independent thought, learning, and research among students. Additionally, the school features two auditoriums equipped with central electronic systems that serve as versatile indoor activity arenas for various In-House events.

Academic-related activities such as Drama, Debating, Elocution, Public Speaking, Art and Craft, Music, Quizzes, Workshops, Dance, Model United Nations (MUN), and Spell Bee are actively encouraged. Students regularly participate in both Inter-House and Inter-School competitions, promoting a spirit of healthy competition and personal growth. Various clubs like Drama, Creative Writing, Dance, Debate, Archery, Mathematics, Science, Gardening, Eco Western Music, Vocal Music, Photography, Art run in the school to encourage the students to be socially and mentally productive.

SPORTS

The boys are trained in Physical Training, Cricket, Football, Hockey, Basketball, Tennis, Athletics, Boxing, Table tennis, Handball, Swimming and Archery.

TOURS, TREKS AND FIELD VISITS

The school organizes annual educational tours, treks, and field visits to places of historical, cultural, and educational significance, including global tours and visits to Pilani's renowned Technological Museum, providing students with enriching experiential learning opportunities and fostering global citizenship.





ROUND SQUARE

The school is a member of the Round Square Conference, an international organization that connects schools around the world, promoting experiential learning and global citizenship. Through this affiliation, students regularly participate in various conference activities, gaining valuable exposure to international events and initiatives that broaden their perspectives and enhance their educational experience.

AFS

The school is a proud member of AFS, which facilitates intercultural learning and exchange programs. This membership allows students to engage in meaningful international experiences, fostering global awareness and understanding.

BSAI

The school is a member of the Boarding Schools' Association in India (BSAI), a prestigious organization dedicated to promoting excellence in boarding education. This membership provides the school access to a network of resources, best practices, and professional development opportunities, ensuring the maintenance of high standards of care and education for its boarding students.

Being part of this association strengthens the school's commitment to creating a supportive and enriching environment that fosters holistic development and personal growth among its students.

UNSO

The school is also a member of the United Nations School Organization (UNSO). Students are encouraged to participate in various programs offered by UNSO to help them understand the concepts of patriotism and universal brotherhood.

EXHIBITIONS

The result will be made available through mail. Once admitted, the students are introduced to a range of innovative and creative learning techniques.



SCHOOL FEES

- 1. Schedule of fees is enclosed with the Registration Form as Annexure one.
- 2. A sum of Rs 25,000/-is charged as admission fee (Non Refundable) it the time of only.
- 3. Personal Account deposits are accountable, and statement of account is sent to parents quarterly.

Term – I Fee (April to September) To be paid at the time of admission. Term – II Fee (October to March) to be paid by 10th of October.

The Fees is realized in two instalments. The first instalment on or before 1st April & second instalment on or before 1st October. Parents requested to pay full fee, partial payment will not be accepted. The Fees may be accepted with a fine of Rs. 200/- per day till 15 days, date for Thereafter, the name of the student will be struck off from the rolls of the school. Student's name be considered on the rolls of the school on special request of parent by depositing Rs. 10000/-as late fee fine.

In case fee is not paid within one month of due date, the student may be sent to his parents at his own expense. Separate letters are not sent to parents or guardians to send fees in respect of their wards.

Fees once deposited will be refunded as per BET rules.

Fee payable at the time of admission will be paid in full. A student may not be allowed to spend from his personal account if the same is in debit balance.

The examination fee is charged from the student taking the board examination. It is realised with the second instalment of the fee.

The mode of payments of fee is the same as mentioned for registration (on Page-21)

WITHDRAWALS

A Student can be withdrawn from the school at the end of an academic year. For this purpose, the guardian should apply in writing to the Principal before 31st March. If a student is withdrawn during the academic session, the fee paid will not be refunded to the guardian. Students are accepted for admission on the understanding that they will remain in the school for the entire academic year.



SCHOOL COMMITTEES

The school is founded on the fundamental principles of democracy by involving students in all important decision-making bodies. Students participate in various committees, including the Mess Committee, Games Committee, Menu Committee, and Film Committee, where they are guided by teachers to make informed decisions.

The school places great emphasis on co-curricular activities, which form an integral part of the curriculum. Following are some of the activities organized by different clubs:

SCIENCE CLUB

The Science Club aims to spark interest in scientific learning. It celebrates Science Week each year and hosts various competitions, including Essay Writing Contests.

KALAM CLUB

The Kalam Club actively engages students in environmental initiatives. Members plant different types of trees and visit villages to educate residents, especially girls, about the importance of environmental conservation.

SAHITYIKA CLUB

The Sahityika Club focuses on developing creative writing skills in both Hindi and English. Original writings are selected and presented by the authors during the Sahityika Assembly, with selected pieces featured in the school newsletter and magazine.

NCC (National Cadet Corps)

The school has all three NCC wings: Army, Navy, and Air. Students from classes VII to IX can join any one of these wings. Participation in the annual camp is a compulsory part of NCC training. Cadets participate in local rallies on Independence Day and Republic Day, and they may also be selected for Advanced Leadership Training Camps and Rock-Climbing activities

SCHOOL BAND

The school band comprises two troops: one for the senior section and one for the junior section. A well-qualified Band Master oversees the training and development of students in the Brass Band. The band actively participates in all school functions and national festivals, enriching the school's cultural atmosphere.



HORSE RIDING

The horse-riding facility is located behind the Middle Section block, where the school maintains a stable with 20 horses. Aqualified riding instructor, along with trained syces, supervises the program. Horse riding is compulsory for all students from Classes VI to XII, and each student is required to pass a riding test at the end of the academic session. Many students achieve high proficiency in skills such as vaulting, jumping, hurdles, and tent pegging.

SWIMMING

The school boasts an international-level short-course swimming pool, and swimming is compulsory for students from Classes V to XII. Interhouse swimming and water polo matches are organized to assess students' efficiency and endurance. Our students also compete in state, national, and IPSC aquatic meets, showcasing their skills on various platforms.

ARCHERY

Archery classes commence from Class V, with the school having its own archery team that participates in national-level competitions. Students are trained by a master archer, helping them develop their skills and compete effectively.

FACILITIES

LIBRARIES

Each section of the school—Senior, Middle, and Junior—features a well-furnished library that caters to the diverse needs of students, all under the supervision of qualified librarians. Central to the academic life of the school is the main library in the Senior Section, which boasts a comprehensive collection of 30,000 academic and reference books, alongside a wide range of journals and periodicals. This library serves as both a serious working environment and a peaceful space for study and recreation for boys of all ages.

On the lower level, there is a dedicated fiction section complete with a comfortable reading room. The library also incorporates a major computer network with filtered internet access, available for student use throughout the week. A trained librarian manages the library, ensuring that an experienced staff member is always available to assist students. Adjacent to the library, there are two separate rooms: one designated for staff and the other for senior students, providing space for independent study and creative pursuits. The staff room is equipped with the latest journals, books, and other reading materials to support professional development.



AUDIO-VISUAL CENTRE

The school features a well-equipped Audio-Visual Centre in the Senior Section, complete with modern educational technology. A trained in-charge oversees the centre, ensuring it remains a valuable resource for both teachers and students.

INTERNET FACILITIES

Dedicated internet connectivity is available 24 hours a day, and the school provides Wi-Fi access throughout the campus. The server connects all departments via a local area network (LAN), facilitating seamless communication and resource sharing.

FRENCH LANGUAGE CLASSES

French has been introduced as an option for students, allowing them to learn this international language for future use.

LANGUAGE LAB

The school is equipped with two full-fledged language labs—one in the Middle Section and another in the Junior Section—designed to enhance language learning and make it more effective for students

SMART CLASSES

The school offers smart classes equipped with interactive smart boards and projectors, enhancing the learning experience for students. These classrooms are integrated with internet access, allowing teachers to incorporate a variety of multimedia resources and interactive tools into their lessons. This technology fosters an engaging and dynamic learning environment, encouraging students to participate actively and enhancing their understanding of the curriculum

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS

To assist parents, the school provides transportation for students traveling to school at the beginning of each term and returning home at the end of the term. Additionally, upon parent request, the school organizes escorted parties to Jaipur and Delhi airports during the Summer and Winter vacations. It is important to note that these arrangements are offered as a voluntary service to parents, not as an obligation. While all necessary precautions are taken, the school and its staff members are not responsible for any inconvenience, loss, or damage that may occur during these trips. Requests for air travel must be submitted at the beginning of the term.

RULES FOR TRAVEL

STUDENTS PARENTS AUTOMATED COMMUNICATION SYSTEM (SPACS)

Each house is equipped with four telephones for the convenience of students, allowing them to make calls to their parents and guardians. Through the SPACS system, students can make calls to designated phone numbers multiple times each month. For urgent matters, calls can be made to the school office between 4:00 PM and 5:30 PM. Additionally, the school provides a Skype facility for students to facilitate communication with their families.

VISITORS AND GUESTS

The Principal and staff warmly welcome opportunities to meet with parents and guardians. Guests are invited to enjoy meals in the school's dining hall; however, they are requested to inform the school of their arrival in advance. It is important for all visitors to abide by the school rules during their stay.

TUCK SHOP

The school operates a tuck shop where students can purchase toiletries and stationery items according to their needs. The costs of these items are debited to the students' personal accounts, ensuring a convenient shopping experience for all.

TAILOR SHOP

The school has its own tailors who stitch school uniforms at prescribed rates. Parents and guardians are encouraged to have the uniforms tailored by the school's tailors to ensure uniformity in the pattern and design of the school uniform.

CANTEEN

To cater to the needs of students between meals, the school operates a canteen on campus. The canteen offers a variety of items, including juices, ice creams, and snacks, which students can purchase using coupons issued to them periodically.

CONTEMPLATION GROUND (GODHULI)

During festivals, students gather at the Contemplation Ground (Godhuli Stadium) in the evening. This assembly features talks by students and faculty members on various topics, and it also serves as a time for meditation, where students sit in silence for a few minutes to reflect and contemplate.



FESTIVALS

The school celebrates various religious festivals, including Holi, Dussehra, Guru Nanak's Birthday, Christmas, and Eid. A Hanuman temple is located on campus, where children are encouraged to worship and say their prayers. Additionally, we periodically conduct Bhajans and Hawans. National festivals such as Independence Day and Republic Day are celebrated with great fervor and enthusiasm, fostering a sense of patriotism and community among the students.

RECREATION

The school is equipped with digital projectors, allowing us to screen educational and feature films in Hindi and English for all students on selected Saturdays and Sundays in the school auditoriums. Each house has a common room where students can enjoy indoor games like carom, chess, and table tennis during their free time. These common rooms are also equipped with TVs that have cable connections, enabling students to view news and events of national and international importance.

VINOBA

The school boasts a well-organized alumni association known as the Vidya Niketan Old Boys Association (VINOBA). Students who have completed a minimum of two years at the school are eligible to apply for membership. More information about the association can be found on its website: www.vinoba.org.





VISITS AND LEAVE RULES

All parents and guardians are requested to adhere to the following rules and regulations in the best interest of their wards:

- Initial Adjustment Period: To help new boys adjust to their environment, parents and guardians are requested to refrain from visiting them for one month after admission.
- Visiting Hours: During the school term, parents are generally allowed to visit on the second Saturday of each month, from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM on Sunday. Under no circumstances should parents approach the boys directly.
- 3. Visitors: Relatives or friends are not permitted to see the students unless they present an introductory letter from the boys' parents or guardians. Visits from relatives or friends may take place on Sundays or holidays.
- 4. Evening Visits: Parents are requested not to visit the school or dormitories after 7:30 PM to meet with the Housemaster, Headmaster, or Principal. No leave will be granted during these visits.
- Designated Meeting Areas: Parents should not meet their wards in their dormitories or study rooms. Meetings should take place in the Reception Hall, Lounge, or Visitor's Room, and only after consulting the Housemaster.
- 6. Local Guardianship: School employees cannot serve as local guardians for students.
- Meeting During School Hours: While parents are not expected to visit the boys during school hours, they are

welcome to sit in the Lounge or Reception area to meet with subject teachers. To discuss their child's progress, parents should use the conference room during the second Saturday visit.

LEAVE RULES

- Home Visits: Boys are not permitted to go home during the school term. Local guardians may meet the child for one hour only on the second Saturday at 4:00 PM, but they are not allowed to keep the child overnight.
- 2. Leave for Family Weddings: A maximum leave of three days may be granted for the wedding of a real brother or sister. This leave will not be permitted during examination days, camps, or important activities. Requests for leave to attend cousin, uncle, or aunt weddings will not be entertained.
- 3. Medical Leave: Leave may be granted for medical treatment if recommended by the school's Medical Officer.
- Leave for Mourning or Illness: Leave may be allowed for mourning or the illness of a family member; however, parents should apply for such leave only when necessary.
- 5. Request Protocol: All leave requests must be submitted to the Principal. No leave will be granted based on student requests alone. Requests made via or email will only be considered in urgent situations.
- 6. Late Return Penalties: Students returning late from leave will incur a fine of 500 per day of delay.



- 7. Extension of Leave: Parents should not extend the return date or time after leave. Failure to comply will result in a deduction of marks in the internal assessment and a fine. If a boy is detained due to illness, the application for leave must include a medical certificate. Fines apply in all cases.
- 8. Compulsory Tours and Treks: No leave will be granted during tours and treks, as these activities are compulsory. If a boy misses these events at the insistence of his parents, the full amount will be charged.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Food Parcels: Parents are discouraged from sending food parcels to the boys.
- Cash Restrictions: Boys are not permitted to keep cash, and no money should be given or sent to them. Parents should refrain from sending money orders, birthday money, cheques, drafts, or any gifts for any reason, as this is against school rules.
- Confiscation of Unauthorized Money: Any unauthorized money found with boys will be confiscated and credited to the staff welfare fund. No cash should be included in the school kit.

Phone Communication: Parents and guardians are requested not to call boys on their personal phones or send mobile phones with them. For urgent matters, calls should be directed to the school office, Headmaster, or Housemaster. Calls can be made from 4:00 PM to 5:30 PM.

- Prohibited Conduct: Any objectionable viewing or misconduct, including ragging and leaving the school or Pilani without permission, is strictly prohibited. Students involved in such activities will not be allowed to continue their studies at the school.



- Travel Arrangements: All travel arrangements should be specified and addressed to the Principal.
- If an escort is sent, a letter of authority with the attested signature and photograph of the parent must accompany the escort. Self-escort is not permitted.
- Disciplinary Action: The Principal reserves the right to ask parents or guardians to withdraw their ward from the school and hostel for misconduct, disregard for school rules, or continued poor academic performance.
- Undertaking Statement: A statement of undertaking will be sent to all parents and guardians, which must be signed by both parents and their wards.
- Birthday Celebrations: No birthday celebrations with outside eatables are allowed. Celebrations will be conducted according to school guidelines only.

MEETING WITH THE PRINCIPAL

Parents may meet the Principal in a group by obtaining permission in writing. This can be scheduled on the second Saturday of the month between 4:00 PM and 6:00 PM.

EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION

An emergency address and contact number must be provided by all parents.

SECURITY

The security of the child is of utmost importance. Vehicles are allowed inside the campus only in designated parking areas.

SCHOOL RULES AND DISPUTES

Parents and guardians are bound by the school rules in all respects. In all matters of dispute, the decision of the Principal is final.

COMPULSORY ACTIVITIES

Parents and guardians are expected to encourage their wards to participate in compulsory activities such as tours, trekking, expeditions, and camping during their stay at the school.

DAMAGE AND RECOVERY

In case of dam age to school property or loss of library books, recovery costs will be charged to the parent of the student concerned.



SERIOUS OFFENSES

- A student may be expelled for offenses that are likely to impair the discipline of the school, including misconduct and disregard for school rules.
- Parents and guardians may also be asked to withdraw their child if academic performance continues to be very poor.
- The decision of the school Disciplinary Committee, headed by the Principal, will be final in all such cases.

COMMUNICATION

- Official letters regarding travel, fees, tours, and treks are periodically sent to parents. However, timely delivery of these letters cannot always be guaranteed.
- Copies of all school correspondence are available on the school website. Parents and guardians are encouraged to check the website regularly to stay informed.
- Any change of address should be communicated to the school immediately in a separate letter marked "Change of Address" in bold.
